Q: What is a fair tax?

 A fair tax has lower rates for lower incomes and higher rates for higher incomes.

Q: What does a fair tax mean for kids & families?

- Over 99% of tax filers pay less income tax
- Raises \$1.9 billion to prevent more cuts

How does a fair tax work?

With a fair tax, those with lower incomes pay a lower rate, and those with higher incomes pay a higher rate.


Single Person Earning \$100,000 A Year*
