
HUD Office of Housing Counseling (OHC)



The mission of the OHC is to help families to obtain, sustain and retain their homes. We accomplish this mission through a strong network of HUD participating housing counseling agencies (HCA) and HUD certified housing counselors.

- Network of approximately 1,497 HCAs and 4,189 HUD certified housing counselors
- Approve new HCAs and certify housing counselors
- Monitor compliance, and the quality of housing counseling
- Connect clients with participating housing counseling agencies
- Grant funding for qualified HCA applicants
- Provide training and technical assistance

HCA Approval



- HUD approves HCAs and certifies housing counselors
- Visit "How to become a HUD participating Housing Counseling agency" to get started on the application (30-90-day process)
- Try the <u>Housing Counseling Agency Eligibility Tool</u>
- Review the <u>learning pathway</u>
- Two paths for HUD participation:
 - Apply for HUD approval as a Local Housing Counseling Agency (LHCA), National or regional intermediary, or Multi-state
 Organization (MSO)
 - Become a participating affiliate of an intermediary

Qualifying Criteria for Applicants



- Nonprofit Status: Must submit evidence of nonprofit status as demonstrated by Section 501 (c) of the Internal Revenue Code or be a government entity
- Certification: Must have a housing counselor that has passed the HUD housing counselor certification exam
- Experience: Must have successfully administered a housing counseling program for at least one year
- Community Base: Must have functioned for at least one year in the proposed geographic service area
- Counseling Resources: Must have sufficient resources to implement its proposed counseling work plan

Housing Counselor Certification Update




- 100% of 1,497 HCAs employ HUD certified housing counselors
- There are approximately 4,189 HUD certified housing counselors
- Added approximately 25 new HUD certified housing counselors per month during FY2022
- There are approximately 361 HECM certified housing counselors
- HUD housing counselor certification information

HUD Certified Housing Counselors by State














Certification Exam



- Counselors only need to pass the exam once
- Available in English and Spanish, HUD is considering adding additional exam languages
- May be taken multiple times; fee must be paid each time
- Fee: \$60 online and \$100 for testing center and can be charged to HUD's comprehensive housing counseling grant
- Accommodation for Limited English Proficiency (LEP) candidates
- Reasonable accommodations are provided in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)
- The exam, practice tests and study guide will be updated annually to remove obsolete questions and add new relevant questions

Employment Certification



- After passing the exam, housing counselors will receive an email, click the link to authorize transfer of exam results to <u>FHA Connection (FHAC)</u>
- Your agency's <u>FHAC coordinator</u> will complete the employment validation process
- HUD certified housing counselor can then commence counseling HUD clients and their certificate can be downloaded and printed from <u>FHA Connection (FHAC)</u>

Certification of Tribal Housing Counselors Proposed Rule



- Proposed rule published on January 26, 2023, on the applicability of the Final Rule for Housing Counseling Certification requirements to other HUD programs utilized by tribal entities, such as the Indian Housing Block Grants and Indian Community Development Block G
- Comments closed date: March 27, 2023

Modernization of the National Industry Standards for Homeownership Education and Counseling



- National Industry Standards for Homeownership Education and Counseling ("the standards") are a set of guidelines published to promote quality homeownership and counseling services. Industry professionals who adopt these standards are trusted to provide consistent, high-quality advice.
- NeighborWorks America (NW) convened and supported the standards advisory council in 2004. They published the standards in 2007. During 2022, NW asked HUD to help support maintenance and modernization of the standards.
- National Industry Standards Update Process

Partnering With Industry on Modernization of the Standards



"Industry Standards: HUD may require, promote, or incentivize the adoption of, and implementation of, housing counseling and education standards, by participating agencies. These standards may include minimum acceptable counseling and education content and activities, training, and testing. These industry standards may be developed or implemented by HUD or by other entities and endorsed by HUD."

HUD Handbook 7610.1 Rev-5, Chapter 3, Paragraph 8

Review: The Case for Modernizing the Standards (1 of 2)

The HBE and HC industry has evolved in the 19 years since 2004:

- Creation of the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (<u>CFPB</u>) and <u>HUD's OHC</u> by the <u>Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of</u> <u>2010</u>
- HUD housing counselor certification including extending future counselor certification to tribal lands through rulemaking
- <u>Disaster preparation HBE and post disaster mitigation housing counseling</u>
- New technology facilitated remote counseling and virtual education, also fostered an online HBE industry that did not exist in 2004
- <u>Fair Housing discrimination protections</u> for persons identifying as LGBTQ+

The Case for Modernizing the Standards (2 of 2)



- New racial equity initiatives include working with <u>Historically Black Colleges</u> and <u>Universities (HBCU)</u>, <u>Tribally Based Institutions (TBI)</u>, <u>Minority Serving</u> <u>Institutions (MSI)</u>, and the <u>Property Appraisal and Valuation Equity (PAVE)</u> interagency task force.
- HUD's Office of Policy Development and Research Long-Term Impact Report: The HUD First-Time Homebuyer Education and Counseling Demonstration identified HBE strengths and weaknesses.
- Increased use of HBE and HUD Certified Housing Counselors by HUD programs, Federal Agencies, Government Sponsored Enterprises (GSE), State Housing Finance Agencies (SHFA), local government agencies and non-profits.

HUD's Role in Modernization



- HUD's OHC supports the modernization of the standards in collaboration with NW and the housing industry. HUD seeks an "Industry forward - HUD supporting" approach that will benefit consumers with a modernized set of standards that are responsive to current and future housing market conditions
- FY23-24 funding for Technical Assistance (TA) to modernize the standards is obligated through <u>HUD's Community Compass (CC)</u> grant
- HUD's CC grantee (ICF) will support convening, scheduling, modernization, and will also build and support a new standards website

Projected Milestones



- Fall-Winter 2023: Begin stakeholder meetings and online feedback
- Winter-Spring 2024: Analyze stakeholder feedback and prepare draft data
- Spring-Summer 2024: Recruit new standards committee members, hold committee meetings to review data and draft new standards, publish modernized standards

FY23 Housing Counseling Homeownership Initiative NOFO



- On July 27, 2023, a <u>preview</u> of the HUD FY2023 Homeownership Initiative Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) was published on <u>HUD's Funding Opportunities Webpage</u>. This new grant uses a negotiated fixed price reimbursement model for pre- and post-purchase housing counseling that realizes homeownership.
- The preview has details on program goals, eligibility requirements, the fixed award amount reimbursement approach, and the rating criteria.

Prepare for the HUD Comprehensive Housing Counseling NOFO (9902 and HCS)



Applicants for the HUD Comprehensive Housing Counseling Notice of Funding Opportunity (CHC NOFO) should review their compliance with all program requirements, including timely and accurate HUD-9902 reporting and validation of Housing Counseling System (HCS) profiles.

- Submit your HUD-9902 reports quarterly. For more information, please review the <u>9902 Online Toolkit</u>.
- Validation of your agency HCS profile is required at least once every 90 days.
 Please review all contact information, such as current address, staff contact information, and Data Universal Number System (DUNS) number. Please see the HCS webpage for instructions on properly validating data in HCS.

Prepare for the HUD Comprehensive Housing Counseling NOFO (Grants.gov)

- OFFICE OF HOUSING COUNSELING
- Applicants must be registered in <u>grants.gov</u>. Registration can take between three to five business days or longer if all steps are not completed in a timely manner. New applicants should review "<u>Registering an Organization</u>" for more information.
- Applicants that have previously completed the registration process must renew or update their registration at the <u>SAM Homepage</u>. If your registration has expired, contact the <u>Federal Service Desk</u> or call 866-606-8220 for assistance.

Promoting Racial Equity in Housing



- Partnering with Minority Serving Institutions (MSI),
 Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) and
 Tribally Based Institutions (TBI)
- The <u>FY 2021-22 Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO)</u>: Provides funding to HCAs that demonstrate partnerships with MSIs
- <u>FY21-22 Training NOFO</u>: Supports partnerships with MSI's on housing counselor education and workforce development training


