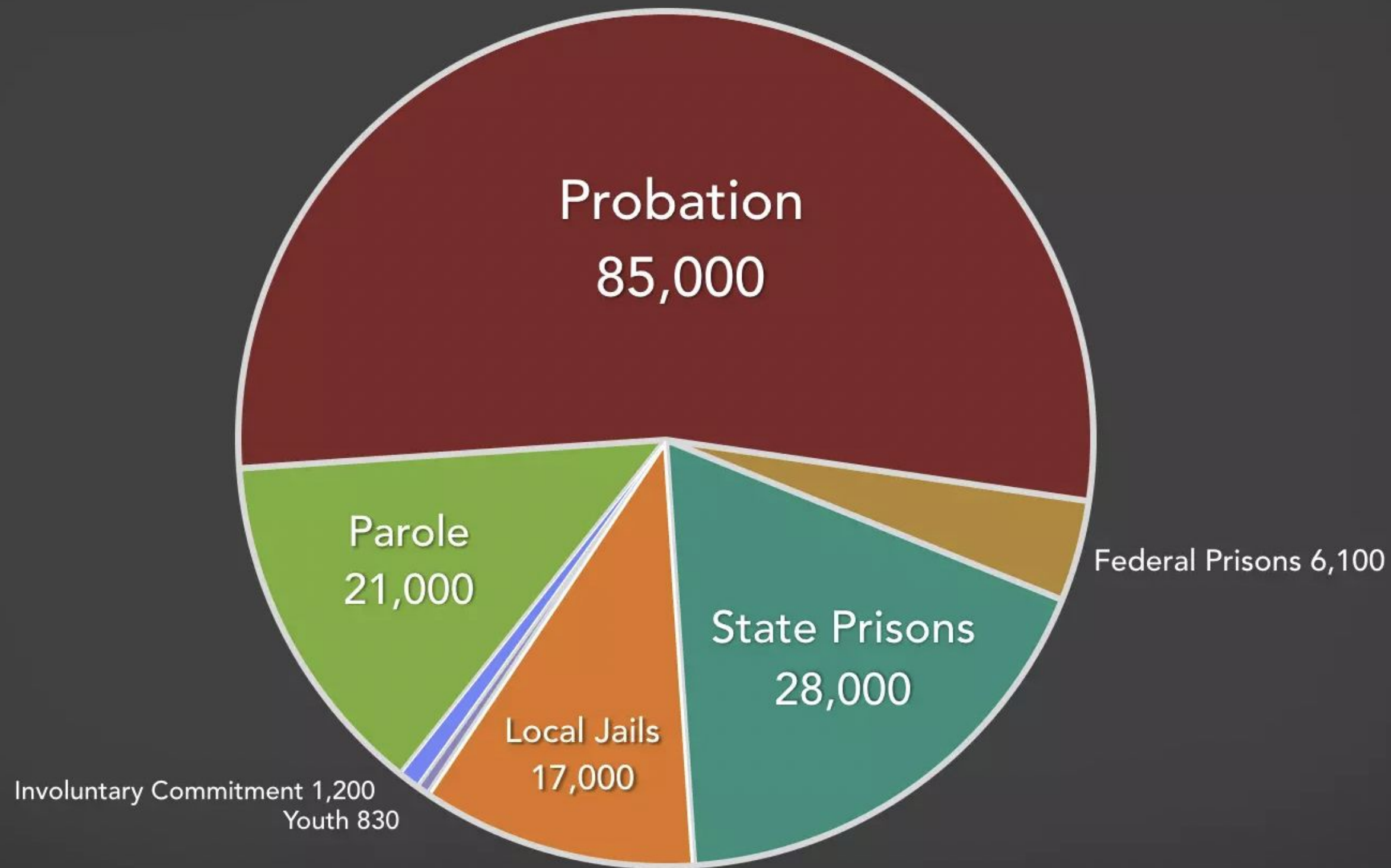

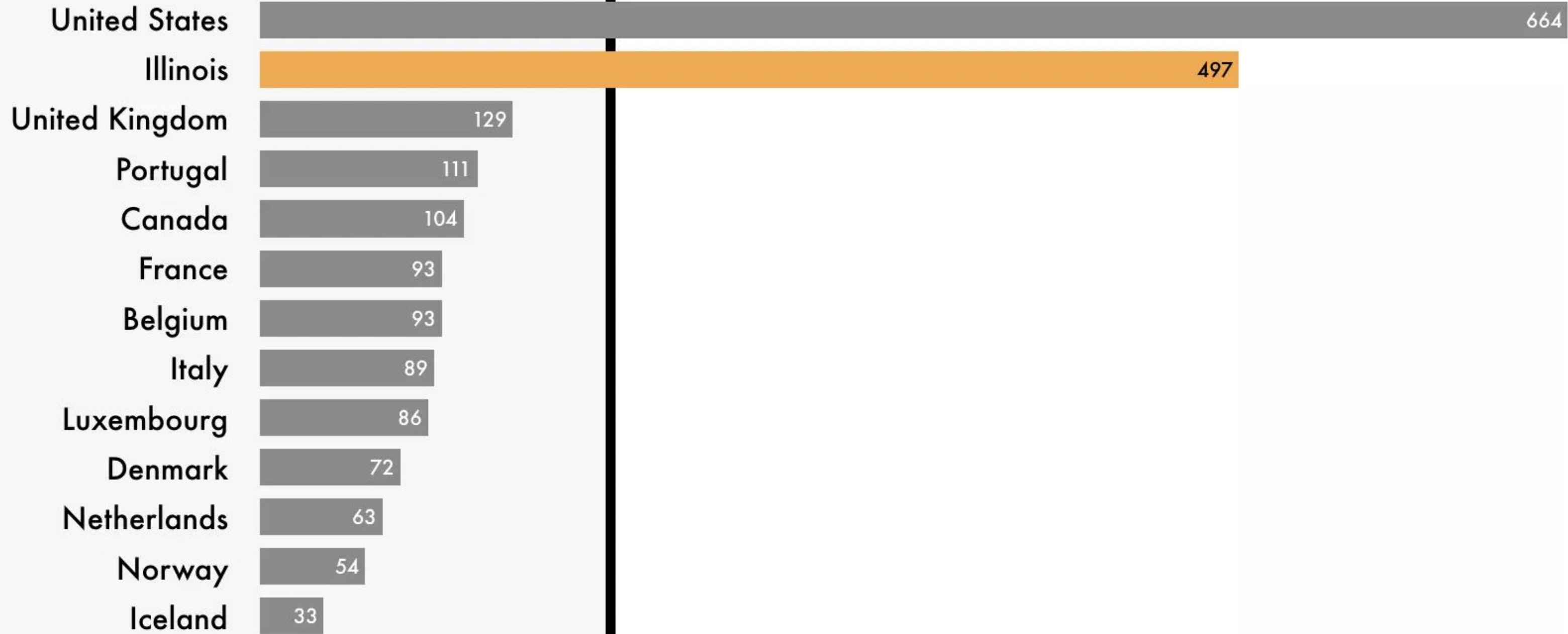
How many people are in Illinois's criminal legal system?

AND FOUNDING NATO COUNTRIES

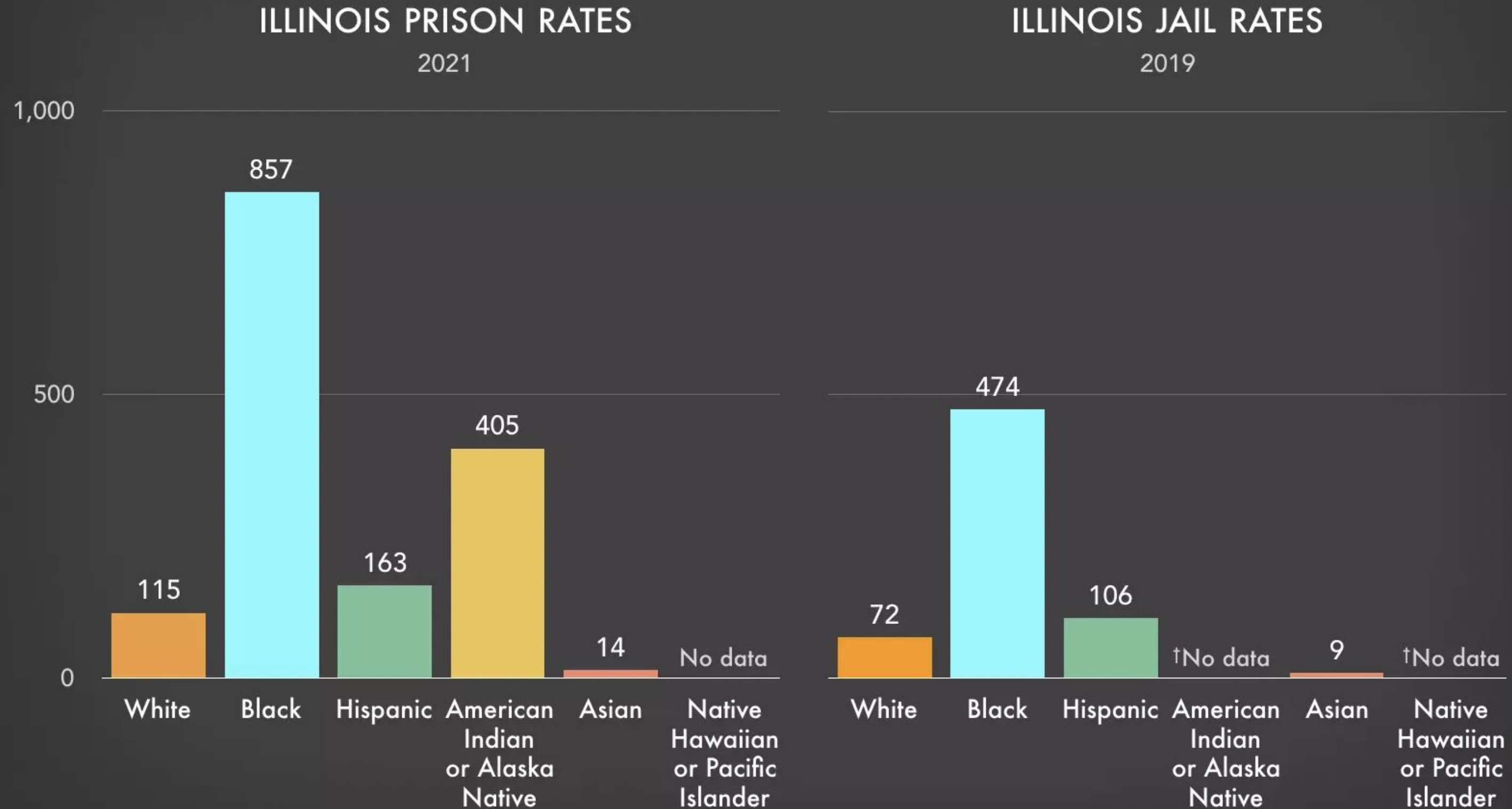


Incarceration rates per 100,000 population

What is the Just Housing Amendment?

(Cook Cty., Ill., Hum. Rts. Ord. § 42-38)



A law that gives over 1 million Cook County residents and their families a fair shot at finding a good home.

- Prohibits discrimination against those with arrest or conviction records in all housing transactions
- 4+ years of advocacy and coalition-building
- Came into effect in February 2020

Exceptions to the JHA

1. Sex offense registrations
2. Child sex offense residency restrictions
3. Producing methamphetamines on federal property IF applying to federally subsidized housing.

What does the JHA do?

1. Unlawful to discriminate
2. Application process changes
3. Enforcement mechanism

Unlawful to discriminate:



“No person shall make any **distinction, discrimination, or restriction** in the price, terms, conditions, or privileges of any real estate transaction, including the decision to engage in or renew any real estate transaction, on the basis of unlawful discrimination or **covered criminal history.**”


The landlord CANNOT...

- X Say “no felonies”; “no criminal record” in the ad
- X Refuse to show a listing
- X Change the listing
- X Ask about criminal history
- X Have a checkbox on the application

New application process


1. Prequalification

2. Background Check



Copy of background check
Applicant has 5 days to respond

3. Consider **ONLY** convictions from last 3 years



Not arrests, citations, dropped charges, juvenile records, expunged records, deferral/diversion programs

4. Recent conviction = written individualized assessment

180 DAYS
(about 6 months)



Enforcement Mechanism



- File complaint with Cook County Commission
- Individual cause of action
- Settlement or mediation
- Damages
- Training and compliance monitoring

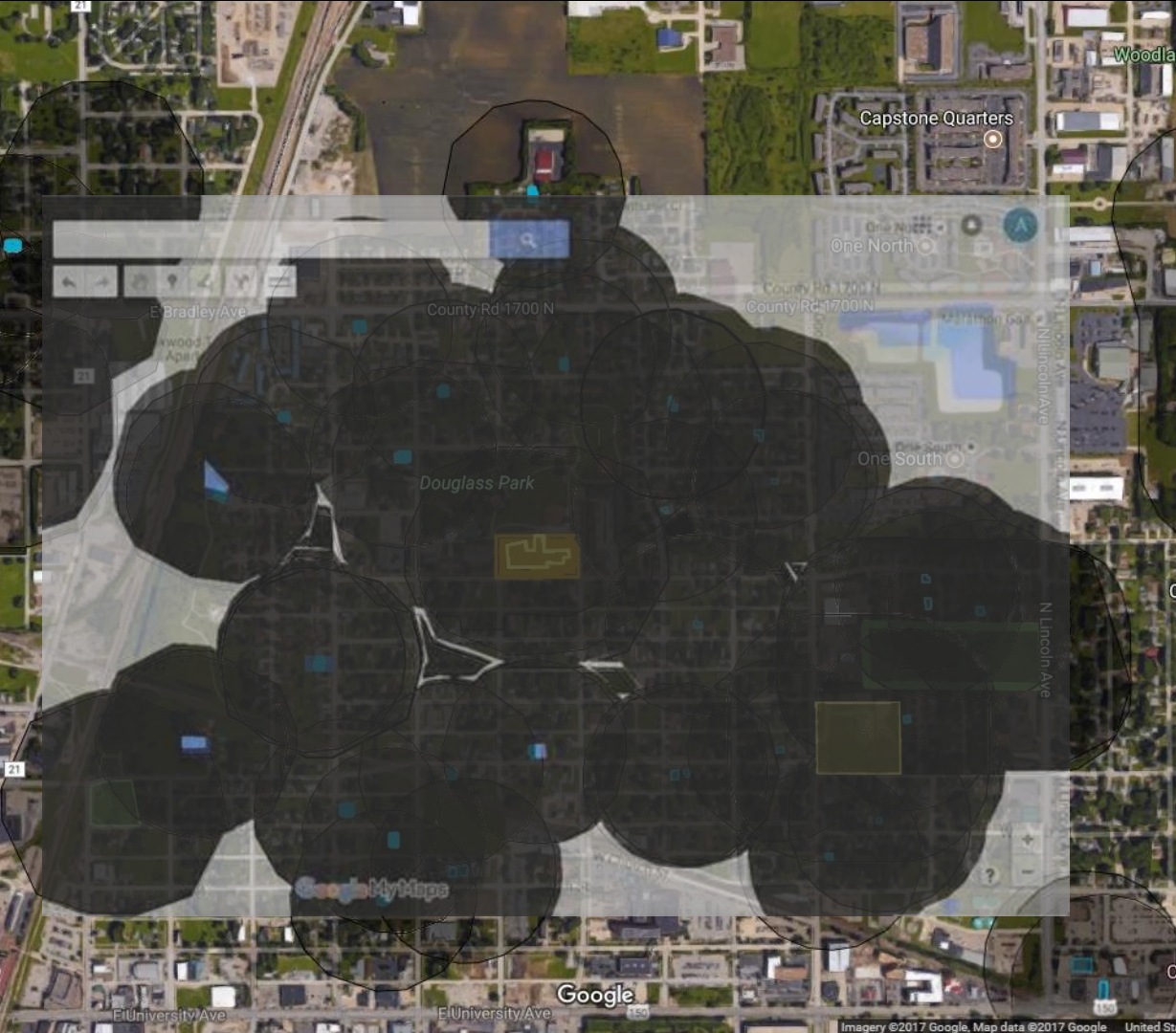
HOUSING BANISHMENT region in Champaign-Urbana



Map depicts 500-foot housing banishment zones.

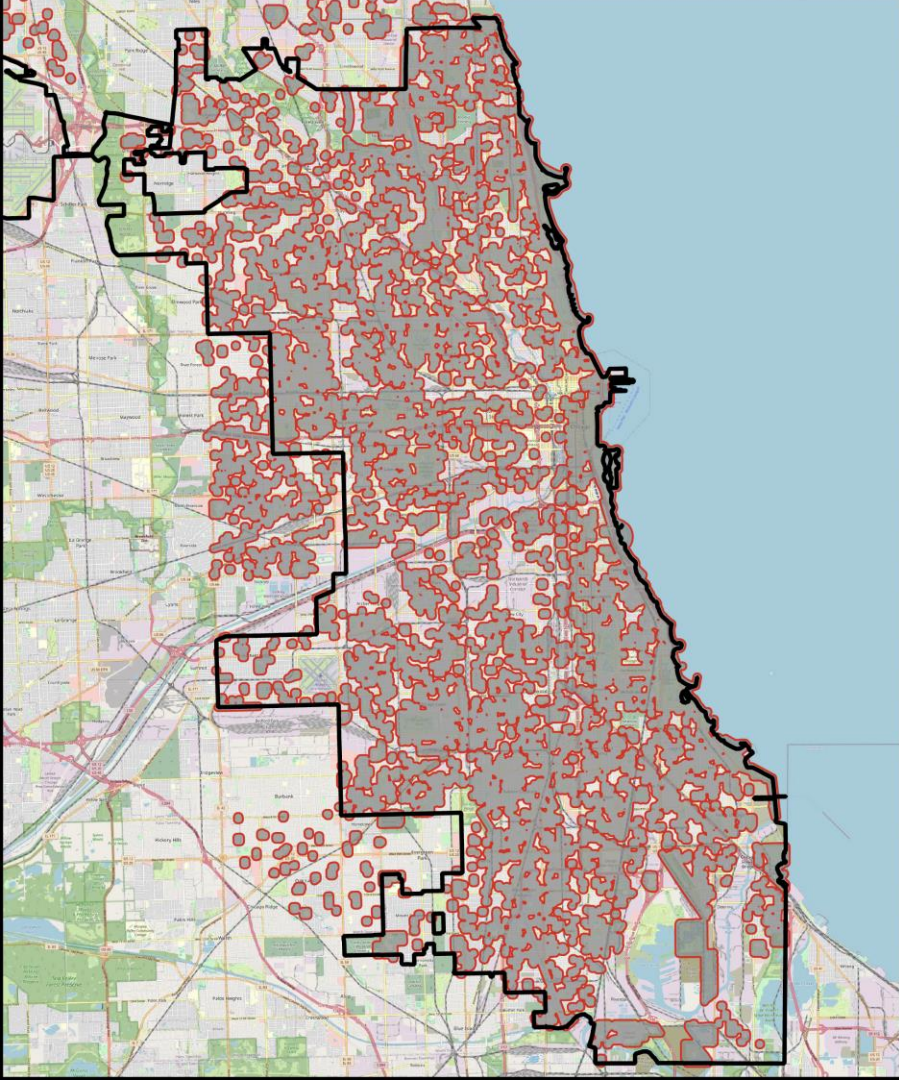

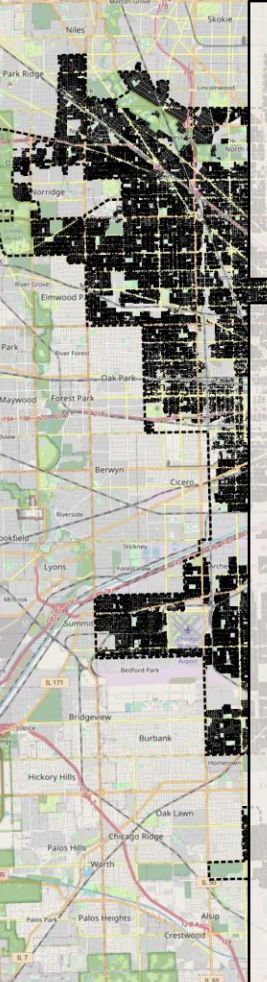

Residential Parcels City of Chicago



• 1/5 of the people on the sex offense registry in Chicago are homeless.

• 80% of those homeless are Black men from the West and South Sides.

• Most had stable housing but their homes were made illegal.

• These laws create churn. People go are housed, become homeless, register weekly, and go to prison.

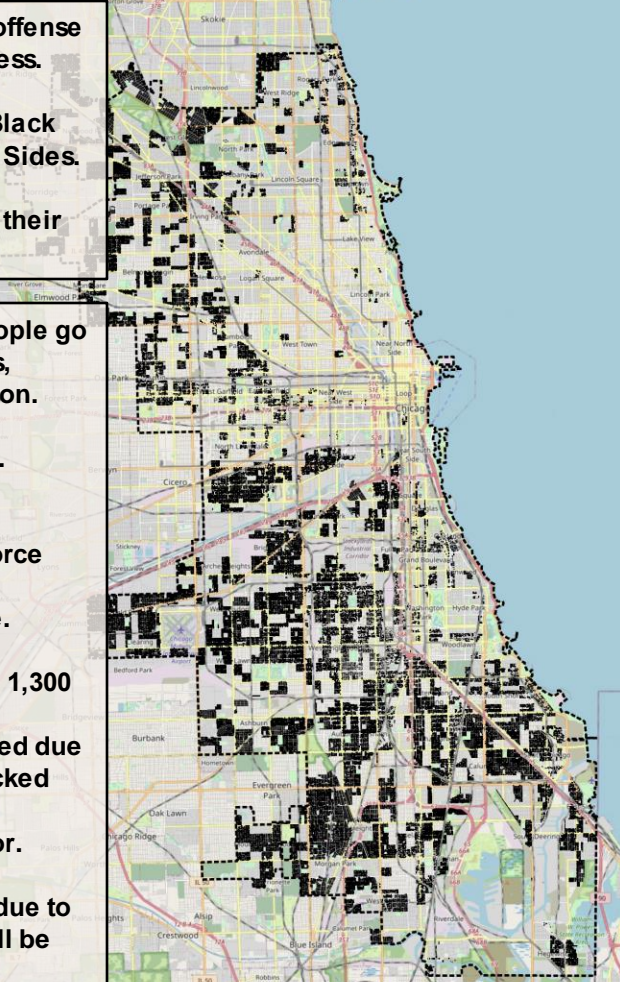
• This cycle lasts an entire life. Housing is never stable.

• Outside prison, these laws force 400-500 Chicagoans into homelessness at any one time.

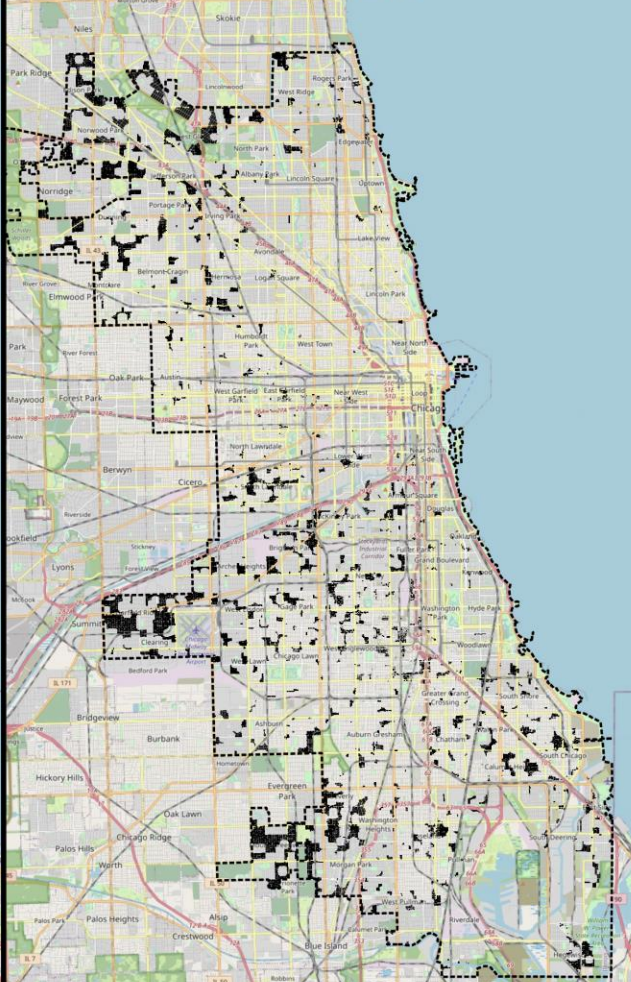
• In IDOC, we have always had 1,300 people incarcerated past their outdates. Now they are released due to a federal injunction and packed into these temporary housing clusters that IDOC is paying for.

• But there is still no housing due to banishment laws. They will still be banished.

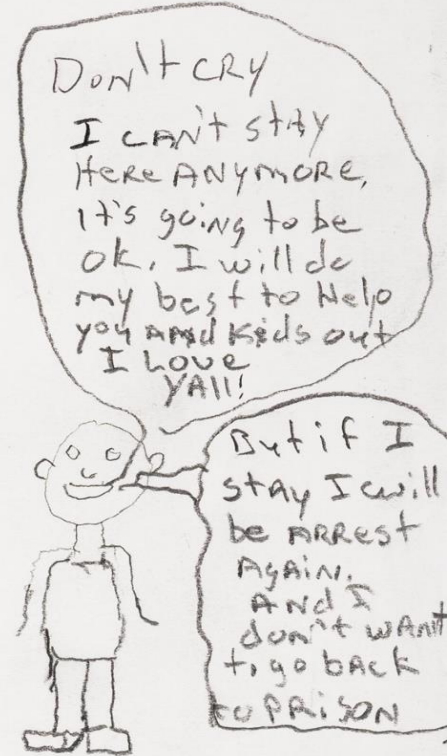
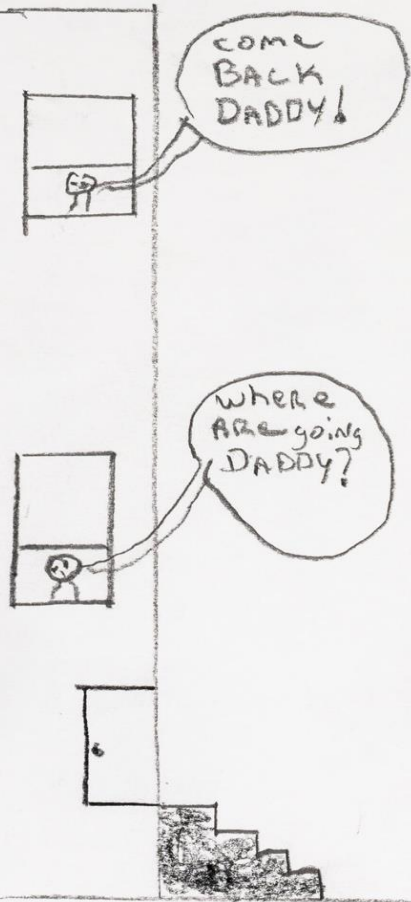
Residential Parcels Median Rent Less Than \$1000

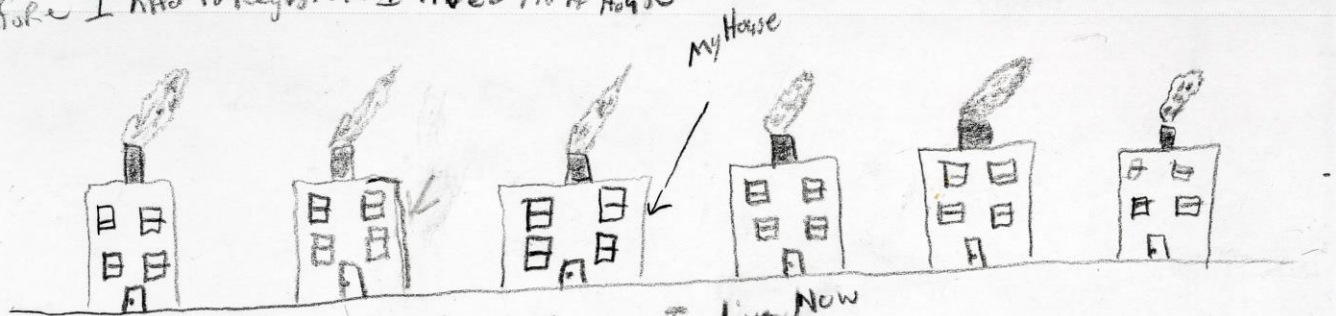

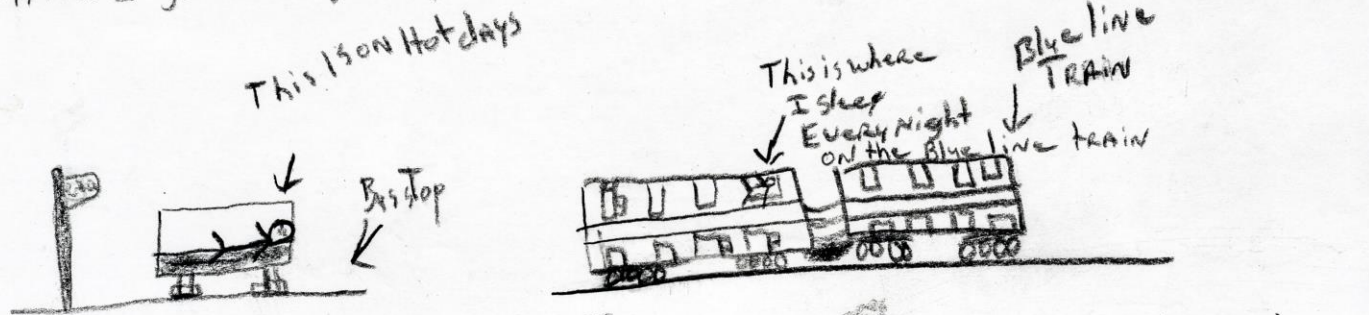

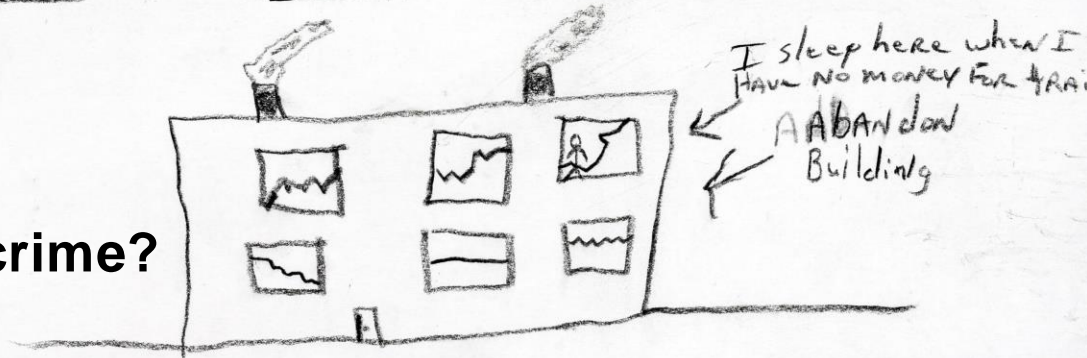

We looked at combined data sets of the past 10 years – IDOC and public conviction registries.

Of those who were ever homeless on a registry in the past 10 years, 53.9% had one or more failure to register felonies.

REDUCE HOUSING BANISHMENT

1. **Reduce housing banishment** from 500 feet to 250 feet. Remove home day care from banishment list.
2. **Grandfather people in.** Do not make a home “illegal” if the banishment zones change.
3. **End weekly.** Allow homeless people to register same as housed people (annually or quarterly).

REDUCE FOOTPRINT OF REGISTRIES

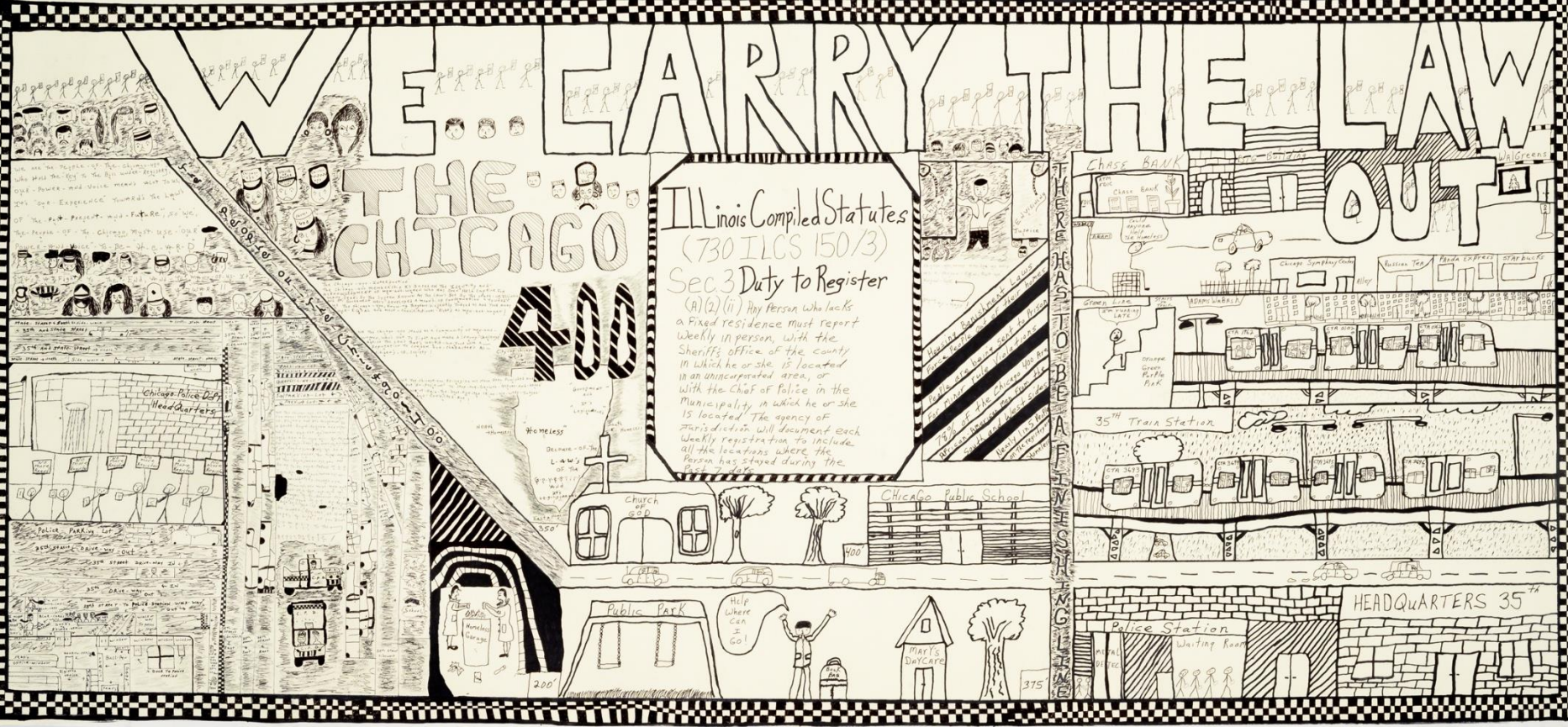
4. **Change failure to register from a felony to a misdemeanor.**
5. **Makes fee waivers standard and easy for poor people.**
6. **Reduce Murder / VOAY from 10 years to 5 years.** (Does not impact lifetime registration.)

Sec 3 Duty to Register

(A)(2)(ii) Any person who lacks a fixed residence must report weekly in person, with the Sheriff's office of the county in which he or she is located in an unincorporated area, or with the Chief of Police in the Municipality in which he or she is located. The agency of the Sheriff's office will document each weekly registration to include all the locations where the person has stayed during the past week.
