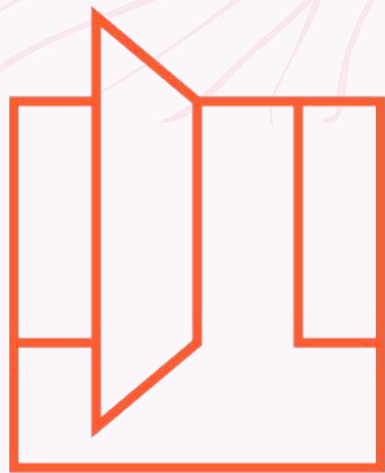

36 Questions for Civic Love

We adapted his questions for use in a new kind of social experiment, aimed at sparking at civic love.

Civic Love is one's love for society, expressed through a commitment to the common good.

Practice Listening and Sharing About Yourself

Resist the urge to respond to your partner's answer.

Allow space to simply share and be heard.

Listen with curiosity.
